We write to respectfully request that you **defer this issue** until the Water Resources Board finishes their review on whether this project will harm the new Cease and Desist Order enforcing compliance with Order 95-10.

Please Update EIR

Since the *project circumstances have changed significantly since the EIR was certified*, e.g. the project has changed and the Cease & Desist for 95-10 was issued, we believe you are legally obligated to update the EIR before taking action.

While the property's rights have been adjudicated it is not clear that all the water for the project will come from the Seaside Basin. An EIR update will examine this issue and show the potential for some of the water to come from the Carmel River.

Deferring action on this item puts the burden on the SWRCB rather than exposing the District to legal action and wasting public money.
