Dear President Peevey:

This letter concerns the Proposed Decision made recently by Administrative Law Judge Maribeth Bushey to deny the application submitted by the California-American Water Company (Cal-Am) for the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) authorization to collect and remit a "user fee" for funding the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District's (MPWMD) Carmel River Mitigation Program and the Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Project. Cal-Am, MPWMD, and the Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) support the application and have signed a Settlement Agreement.

MPWMD has implemented the Mitigation Program for Cal-Am for nearly two decades. The Proposed Decision notes, "if the Management District ceases to perform these mitigation measures, then Cal-Am must prepare and implement a plan to meet this responsibility." (Proposed Opinion at17). However, the Proposed Decision makes no provision for Cal-Am to start a new program on its own. Moreover, Cal-Am has repeatedly stated that MPWMD is best equipped to carry out the Mitigation Program in a cost-effective manner, thus, if the Proposed Decision is approved by the PUC, the MPWMD will likely have to suspend the Carmel River Mitigation Program and the ASR.

Discontinuation of the Mitigation Program is a great concern of NOAA's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS), as it will result in adverse effects to the Carmel River's run of the federally-listed, threatened South-Central California Coast steelhead Distinct Population Segment, and their designated critical habitat. Components of the Mitigation Program include fish rescue and relocation for rearing, streamside erosion control and restoration, lagoon management, surface and groundwater monitoring, and water conservation. Cal-Am and MPWMD have also



cooperated on the ASR Project, which enhances the Carmel River by diverting excess winter stream flow into the Seaside Basin, then extracting stored Seaside Basin water during summer. These actions have improved river conditions to the benefit of people, fish and wildlife.

For the above reasons, NMFS encourages the PUC to approve Cal-Am's Application No. 10-01-012 and to modify the Proposed Decision to accept the Settlement Agreement among Cal-Am, MPWMD, and DRA.

SUBJECT: Support for Application No. 10-01-012 to Continue Collection of Monterey Peninsula Water Management District User Fee for Carmel River Mitigation Program and Aquifer Storage and Recovery Project

Dear President Peevey:

I am writing to support Application No. 10-01-012 submitted by Californian American Water Company (Cal-Am) to continue collection of the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District (MPWMD or District) User Fee to fund the Carmel River Mitigation Program and the Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Project. The User Fee has been collected for 26 years as a surcharge on the Cal-Am water bill. Importantly, the public directly participates in MPWMD program oversight and budget development through local public hearings each year.

Cal-Am and MPWMD have cooperated for nearly two decades on the Mitigation Program, which is required by the State to offset the environmental impacts of the Monterey Peninsula's use of water from the Carmel River. Components include fish rescue and rearing, streamside erosion control and restoration, lagoon management, surface and groundwater monitoring, and water conservation. Cal-Am and MPWMD have also cooperated on the ASR Project, which enhances the Carmel River by diverting excess winter stream flow into the Seaside Basin, then extracting stored Seaside Basin water during summer. These actions have improved river conditioned to the benefit of people, fish, and wildlife.

Funding for this successful partnership is threatened by the December 2010 Proposed Decision issued by Administrative Law Judge Maribeth Bushey. The Proposed Decision would deny Cal-Am's Application to reinstate the District's User Fee on the Cal-Am bill, even though Cal-Am, MPWMD and the Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) support the application and have signed a Settlement Agreement. Cal-Am has repeatedly stated that MPWMD is best equipped to carry out the Mitigation Program in a cost-effective manner.

The Proposed Decision includes inaccurate assertions about District programs, but does not allow MPWMD the opportunity to set the record straight in a public hearing. The Proposed Decision is also flawed because it interferes with the authority of a governmental agency to lawfully enact fees for needed services.

I am concerned that the Proposed Decision would interrupt the long standing MPWMD fisheries, riparian, lagoon, hydrology, water conservation and water supply programs that have protected our primary source of water supply. If the MPWMD program ends, Cal-Am is required to start a new program on its own. This is no time to interrupt the Mitigation Program activities while the community strives to comply with the many state and federal directives that affect our water supply.

For the above reasons, I encourage you to approve Cal-Am's Application No. 10-01-012 and to modify the Proposed Decision to accept the Settlement Agreement among Cal-Am, MPWMD, and DRA. Alternatively, a public hearing should be set to allow MPWMD to answer questions and provide factual information about its programs. I believe the District Mitigation Program and ASR Project User Fees should continue as they are non-duplicative, reasonable and prudent.



Urgent Letter Request

Dear folks who love our waterways, watersheds and the oceans;

We need your help in writing letters to the CPUC (CA Public Utilities Commission).

A top official with the CPUC decided last week that the Monterey Peninsula Water Mgmnt Dist (MPWMD) should not be entitled to \$3.5million in "user fees" that have been added to water bills (\$30-40 per month max per customer). (See http://www.pineconearchive.com/101231-1.htm for more details.) This decision will cut the budget in half.....and the reason for us writing letters...resulting in devastating changes in the management and protection of water resources "for the benefit of the community and the environment" (the district's reason for existence).

The cuts will probably result in eliminating the steelhead program (counting, monitoring and rearing) and eliminate the riparian vegetation program, lagoon monitoring program and other programs that contribute to the health of the Carmel River's natural ecosystem. The programs are supported by Cal Am, MPWMD and the Division of Ratepayer Advocates.

Dear CPUC Commissioners and Officials;

I am writing because of grave concern over the recent decision by Judge Bushey to eliminate the \$3.5million in "user fees" supported by Cal Am, the Monterey Peninsula

Water Management District, the Division of Ratepayer Advocates and thousands of people on the Monterey Peninsula, like me, who want our rivers, waters and fish to be as healthy as possible.

The water crisis is a separate issue from the Water District's 1977 mandate to "manage, augment and protect water resources for the benefit of the community and the environment". The \$3.5 million is specifically targeted to protect the health of the river, its wildlife, the health of the lagoon, mitigation of harmful flows and floods, protection of the Aquifer and Storage Recovery. It is not targeted to solve the mismanagement of water on the Peninsula.

Please restore the fees. That will ensure that the river and water programs for the long term health of our communities, human and otherwise, will not be permanently eliminated, perhaps never to be restored in the future.
