Comments from the delivery end of the nose -

I am a ratepayer and I think ratepayers are getting taxed.

One of many reasons - the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District - instead of providing transparency and leadership ~~to~~, understandable to the public, is ~~leading~~ to public confusion.

Example: The District Board on 8/15 reversed a decision made July 18 to form a committee to study the WaterPlus proposal that it purchase Cal-Am. I was in attendance July 18. No statement was issued regarding the reversal - more time is being wasted.

The President of the Carmel River Steelhead Association said -
"this was an excellent example of a government agency being responsive to its constituents. I see it as a decision made behind closed doors - an excellent example of a government agency treating its most numerous constituency like mushrooms."

Another example: Dick Heuer, with excellent bona fides, has proposed "Reconsidering the Dam" - as argumentatice as this may be it has very substantive reasons to be giving a fair hearing. Two of those reasons are: 1) If we had started a dam in the 1980s - we would today have 24,000 acre ft. of water waiting for our use - its value would range from \$6 million at 4,000 acre ft. to *180 million @ 7,500 acre ft -

~~*these are estimates for dead deliveries.~~

2) Mr. Heuer can make a persuasive argument that a dam today would cost less than half the cost of a dead facility - and it would pay for itself.

~~The District's only answer seems to be it is too late to change horses in mid stream - if I may flog the Water Conservation line's up.~~
