MONTEREY PENINSULA WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT CARMEL RIVER ADVISORY COMMITTEE April 4, 2013

1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

4. UPDATE AND DISCUSSION ON CARMEL RIVER WATERSHED CONSERVANCY ACTIVITIES

BACKGROUND: This is a regular agenda item. Lorin Letendre, President of the Carmel River Watershed Conservancy (CRWC), will update the Committee about CRWC activities.

RECOMMENDATION: No action is required. This is a discussion item.

5. UPDATE ON CARMEL RIVER TASK FORCE

BACKGROUND: Rami Shihadeh from the Resource Conservation District Monterey County will give an update on the current Carmel River Task Force activities.

RECOMMENDATION: No action is required. This is a discussion item.

6. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

a. MONTEREY PENINSULA WATER SUPPLY PROJECTS

BACKGROUND: At its March 18, 2013 meeting, the MPWMD Board directed staff to enter into negotiations with DeepWater Desal (DWD) to establish a cost-sharing relationship for the environmental and permitting work necessary to advance that project as an alternative to the Cal-Am proposal. Staff will update the committee on the DWD proposal and on the proposal by Cal-Am. MPWMD has also executed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Monterey Peninsula Regional Pollution Control Agency for development of a recycled water project and is currently working on a cost sharing agreement to complete environmental analysis.

The focus of these projects is to reduce unauthorized diversions of the Carmel River by Cal-Am. Recent proposals for new water supply have also included the goal of expanding the supply to include lots of record within the MPWMD District.

b. MPWMD RESPONSE TO NATIONAL MARINE FISHERIES SERVICE DRAFT RECOVERY PLAN FOR CENTRAL COAST STEELHEAD

BACKGROUND: At its December 10, 2012 meeting, the MPWMD Board directed staff to

prepare written comments to the National Marine Fisheries Service concerning proposed recovery actions for steelhead in the Carmel River watershed. In late February 2013, MPWMD Board members Jeanne Byrne and Robert Brower met in Washington, D.C. with senior officials within the Department of Interior and with Representative Sam Farr to convey their concerns about long-term potential effects of planed recovery activities on steelhead, water rights, property, infrastructure, and streamside resources.

c. SAN CLEMENTE DAM REMOVAL AND CARMEL RIVER REROUTE PROJECT

BACKGROUND: In response to direction from the Monterey County Planning Commission, California American Water is evaluating an alternative access route to the project site for transport of construction equipment and materials. The route would access the project west of the existing Sleepy Hollow subdivision, instead of through Cachagua Valley. Access road improvements and initiation of the project is tentatively planned for the summer of 2013.

d. CARMEL RIVER LAGOON ECOSYSTEM PROTECTIVE BARRIER AND SCENIC ROAD PROTECTION PROJECT (for discussion if this is not covered in Items 4 and 5)

BACKGROUND: On March 25, 2013, Monterey County presented initial findings and proposed alternatives for locating a barrier on the north side of the Carmel River lagoon and for protection of Scenic Road from bluff erosion. The feasibility studies are focused on finding the best alternative to continued mechanical breaching of the barrier beach across the mouth of the Carmel River.

RECOMMENDATION: No actions are required. This is a discussion item.

1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

2. PUBLIC COMMENT – None

- 3. CONSENT CALENDAR Margaret Robins made a motion to approve the minutes from the November 29, 2012 Regular Meeting, and was seconded by Lance Monosoff. **The minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.**
- 4. UPDATE AND DISCUSSION ON CARMEL RIVER WATERSHED CONSERVANCY ACTIVITIES Lorin Letendre was absent from the meeting so there was not an update on Carmel River Watershed Activities.
- 5. UPDATE ON CARMEL RIVER TASK FORCE Rami Shihadeh of RCDMC stated that the RCDMC has completed the Carmel River Conservation Manual. In addition, Rami stated that a Watershed Awareness Day is scheduled for this spring on May 19, 2013.
- 6. UPDATE ON WATER SUPPLY PROJECTS Dave Stoldt, General Manager of MPWMD, presented the current status of water supply projects. Highlights included a discussion on the water supply gap and how 3 projects combined (desalination, aquifer storage and recovery, and groundwater replenishment) could fill the supply gap. Frank Pierce stated that he would like to know how much water was being used by tourists visiting the peninsula versus the local population.
- 7. FUTURE OF LOS PADRES DAM AND THE DISTRICT'S ROLE, INCLUDING PUBLIC SUPPORT FOR DISTRICT OWNERSHIP Thomas Christensen of MPWMD provided a general summary of Los Padres Dam. The staff note on this item contained a lot of information on Los Padres Dam as well as information on the "Public Review Draft South-Central California Coast Steelhead Recovery Plan." After some discussion, John Dalessio recommended that Carmel River Advisory Committee members read the staff note and email comments to him or MPWMD which would then be incorporated into a letter.
