1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

MEMBERS PRESENT: Lance Monosoff, Thomas House, Frank Pierce, Larry Levine, and

Margaret Robbins

MEMBERS ABSENT: Vincent Frumkin

PUBLIC PRESENT: Ken Ekelund and Beverly Chaney STAFF PRESENT: Larry Hampson, Thomas Christensen

- 2. PUBLIC COMMENT Ken Ekelund brought a draft Plan for the Carmel Canine Sports Center that talked about limiting access to the riparian corridor to help preserve the habitat.
- 3. CONSENT CALENDAR Frank Pierce made a motion to approve the minutes from the September 26, 2013 Regular Meeting, and was seconded by Margaret Robbins. **The minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.**
- 4. PRESENT CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION TO JOHN DALESSIO FOR SERVICE ON THE CARMEL RIVER ADVISORY COMMITTEE Just before the meeting John Dalessio called and said he enjoyed serving on the committee but didn't feel it was necessary to present a certificate to him. By consensus, the Committee urged staff to recognize Mr. Dalessio for his service.
- 5. ELECTION OF CHAIR FOR THE REMAINDER OF FISCAL YEAR 2013 2014-Larry Levine made a motion to elect Lance Monosoff for Chair and was seconded by Margaret Robins. The motion to approve Lance Monosoff as Chair passed by a 5-0 vote. Margaret Robins made a motion to elect Larry Levine for Vice-Chair and was seconded by Thomas House. The motion to approve Larry Levine as Vice-Chair passed by a 5-0 vote.
- 6. UPDATE AND DISCUSSION ON CARMEL RIVER WATERSHED CONSERVANCY ACTIVITIES Lorin Letendre stated the CRWC has updated their list of watershed projects (54 projects) on their website. He also stated that he is serving on the Carmel River Task Force and Heritage Project Committee. He said that it is possible that the Carmel River could be designated as a National Heritage Area and the goal is to erect signs that educate the public on the history and restoration of Carmel Valley.

In addition, he stated that CSA 1 is waiting for the Lagoon Assessment from Denise Duffy and Associates regarding the Ecosystem Protection Barrier and that Dave Potter is trying to get State Parks to give up some land for the project.

- 7. UPDATE AND DISCUSSION ON RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT MONTEREY COUNTY ACTIVITIES Rami Shihadeh stated the RCDMC is updating the Watershed Management Plan and is in the final stretch of the 3 year grant. He stated that the Carmel River Task Force meetings have given people the chance to share their projects and ideas related to restoration in the Carmel River Watershed.
- 8. UPDATE FROM CAL-AM ON SAN CLEMENTE DAM Aman Gonzalez stated that all the geotechnical work is done and complete designs are under review associated with the removal of San Clemente Dam. He also stated that the access road to the project is complete and that the vegetation has been cleared behind the dam so the earth moving can proceed. Aman informed the group that the project was on hold during the winter season and will resume on May 15, 2014.

9. STAFF REPORTS –

- A. Monterey Peninsula Water Supply Projects Larry Hampson stated that Cal-Am is trying to get permission from the City of Marina for slant wells and released an aggressive schedule for the Final EIR to come out in June of 2014. Larry also stated that MPWMD was working with Deep Water Desal as a backup project in case Cal-Am's project falls through.
- B. Update on Current Rainfall and Runoff Conditions Thomas Christensen stated that the current rainfall total was 1.08 inches and that the average to date was 11.2 inches at San Clemente Dam which corresponds to 9.6 percent of average to date. He also stated that runoff was 4 percent of average to date.
- C. Final South-Central California Steelhead Recovery Plan Larry Hampson stated the MPWMD's main concern with the Recovery Plan is the removal of Los Padres Dam. MPWMD proposed to change the Recovery Plan to insure fish passage at Los Padres Dam for all life stages. Larry also stated that the Shibatani Group (MPWMD Consultant) recommended removal of Los Padres Dam with new storage on Pine or Cachagua Creek using a tunnel to divert the water from the Carmel River.
- D. Update on Cal-Am Settlement Agreement Larry Hampson stated that settlement funds were going to be transferred to the California State Coastal Conservancy. These funds will help upgrade the Sleepy Hollow Rearing Facility Intake as well as fund a new bridge across the Carmel River to give access to the facility. Funds may also be used to remove old Carmel River Dam.
