Remarks

This reach began at a private gate off of a dirt cut road. There are many large healthy maples, sycamores and buckyeyes. However, there are not a lot of small riparian plants or willows in this reach. Despite this lack the area has adequate cover to withstand and dissipate a large stream flow event.

There is an accessible floodplain that is mainly vegetated by upland species and (currently) dry grasses.

Despite the close proximity of the dirt cut road there is not excess sediment found in this reach. Large cobbles and rocks are clearly visible throughout the creekbed in this reach.

There is plenty of LWD and boulders to dissipate energy in this reach.
